Director's Biography: Tal Kantor is an award-winning animator and visual artist. She graduated with honors from the Bezalel Academy of Arts and Design in Jerusalem, where she currently teaches in the Screen Arts Department. In her works, Tal deals with the subject of memory and uses a unique technique that she developed which combines drawing, photography, video, painting and animation.

Her animated short film **IN OTHER WORDS** won 17 awards and was officially selected in more than 100 festivals around the world. She directed the animation for the feature documentary **ADVOCATE** (winner of the 2021 Emmy Award, shortlisted for the 2020 Oscar). **LETTER TO A PIG**, which won the "Excellence Award" at the Japan Media Arts Festival and the Best First Film Award at Animafest Zagreb (2022), is her first film.

Director's Biography: Dave Mullins is a Two-Time Academy Award® nominated writer, director, and animator renowned for his significant contributions to storytelling and filmmaking. As the co-founder of ElectroLeague, he draws from a rich two-decade career at Pixar Animation Studios. Best known for his directorial debut, the emotionally resonant short film **LOU**, Dave earned an Academy Award® nomination for Best Animated Short Film. The film received acclaim at events such as SXSW® Film Festival and the San Francisco International Film Festival, earning nominations for Best Animated Short and Best Family Film, respectively. During his tenure at Pixar, Dave played a pivotal role in overseeing animation for Academy Award®-winning masterpieces like **UP** and **SOUL**. His artistic contributions extended to other acclaimed projects, including the Academy Award®-nominated **INCREDIBLES 2** and Golden Globe®-nominated films like **CARS 2** and **THE GOOD DINOSAUR**. Dave's animation journey began in 1995 at Walt Disney Feature Animation, leading to notable roles at Sony Imageworks and Digital Domain. His credits include iconic films like **STUART LITTLE, MONSTERS INC., FINDING NEMO, CARS, RATATOUILLE, BRAVE, INSIDE OUT**, and **COCO**. In addition to his creative pursuits, Dave studied computer science at Brown University and earned his BFA at Rhode Island School of Design. His technical expertise at Pixar is evident in four awarded patents, showcasing his vital role in developing groundbreaking animation tools for some of Pixar's most successful films.

Synopsis: Inspired by a true story, **INVINCIBLE** recounts the last 48 hours in the life of Marc-Antoine Bernier, a 14-year-old boy on a desperate quest for freedom.

Director's Biography: Vincent René-Lortie is a Canadian film director and screenwriter known for his grounded, dreamlike narratives. His work is a testament to purposeful and deeply personal storytelling, intended to make his audience reflect on themes such as mental health and childhood. He is a graduate of Montreal's Mel Hoppenheim School of Cinema, and is a member of the Young Guns '20 class, an award ceremony dedicated to creatives under 30 from across the globe.

INVINCIBLE (2022), his debut narrative short, won the Special Jury Prize at the Clermont-Ferrand Film Festival and has since garnered several international accolades. Most recently, Vincent has been focusing on bringing to life the experimental film **LA PEAU DE L'AUTRE** (2023), currently in post-production, and is developing his first feature film, **YOU WERE ALWAYS AN ISLAND**.

Marc's death raised many complicated questions to which I didn't yet have the answers. But, through making this film, I found a way to dive into that dark, tragic abyss in order to better understand my friend and the decisions that led up to his death. I learned more about Marc and, more broadly, mental health and behavioral issues that many teenagers face daily.

I hope this film will **raise more questions** and **draw awareness** to the incomprehension that is still very strong in our society towards **teenage mental health**. Becoming aware of these **stories** and **opening dialogues** may help us prevent events like Marc's.
